Dr. Petschonek brought that knowledge to Memphis and began Volunteer Odyssey in 2013.

Tracked more than 70,700 volunteer hours.




Created an economic impact of more than \$1.5 million.

- April 2018: Launched partnership with the City of Germantown called Volunteer Germantown.
- May 2018: Officially launched #theHeartofMemphis mural. An interactive mural that can match passersby with volunteer opportunities 24/7.
- November 2018: The National Corporation of Community Service announced that Memphis was ranked #24 out of 50 in citywide community service. Meaning that Memphis has moved up 21 spots since Volunteer Odyssey was founded.





Why Volunteer Odyssey

Volunteer Odyssey's Purpose

Volunteer Odyssey's mission is to develop a pathway to volunteering that enriches our lives and communities.

Despite Memphis being known as one of the most philanthropic cities, we have traditionally had one of the lowest volunteer rates in the country (Corporation for National and Community Service, 2016). Volunteering is not just "good" for our community – it's crucial. Our nonprofits need more volunteers to achieve their missions, such as feeding our families, educating our children, and helping Memphis reach its fullest potential.

Our Work

Volunteer Odyssey creates a culture of volunteerism, which strengthens the entire Memphis community.

- -Comprehensive volunteer portal: We use our platform, VolunteerCompass to recruit volunteers, assess volunteer experience quality, and track volunteer hours.
- -Quality volunteer time: Our nonprofit partners meet quality standards, which helps ensure volunteer success.
- -Capacity building: We provide workshops, advice, and consulting to our nonprofit partners to help them build high-quality, effective volunteer programs.
- -City-wide data tracking: Through our VolunteerCompass we track volunteer impact and hours in real time throughout Memphis.

Our Goals

Volunteer Odyssey strives to create a culture of volunteerism in Memphis. Our top three priorities are:

- 1) Ensure volunteers have a quality volunteer experience
- 2) Build a diverse and inclusive volunteer ecosystem
- 3) Provide resources to nonprofits to advance their volunteer programs
